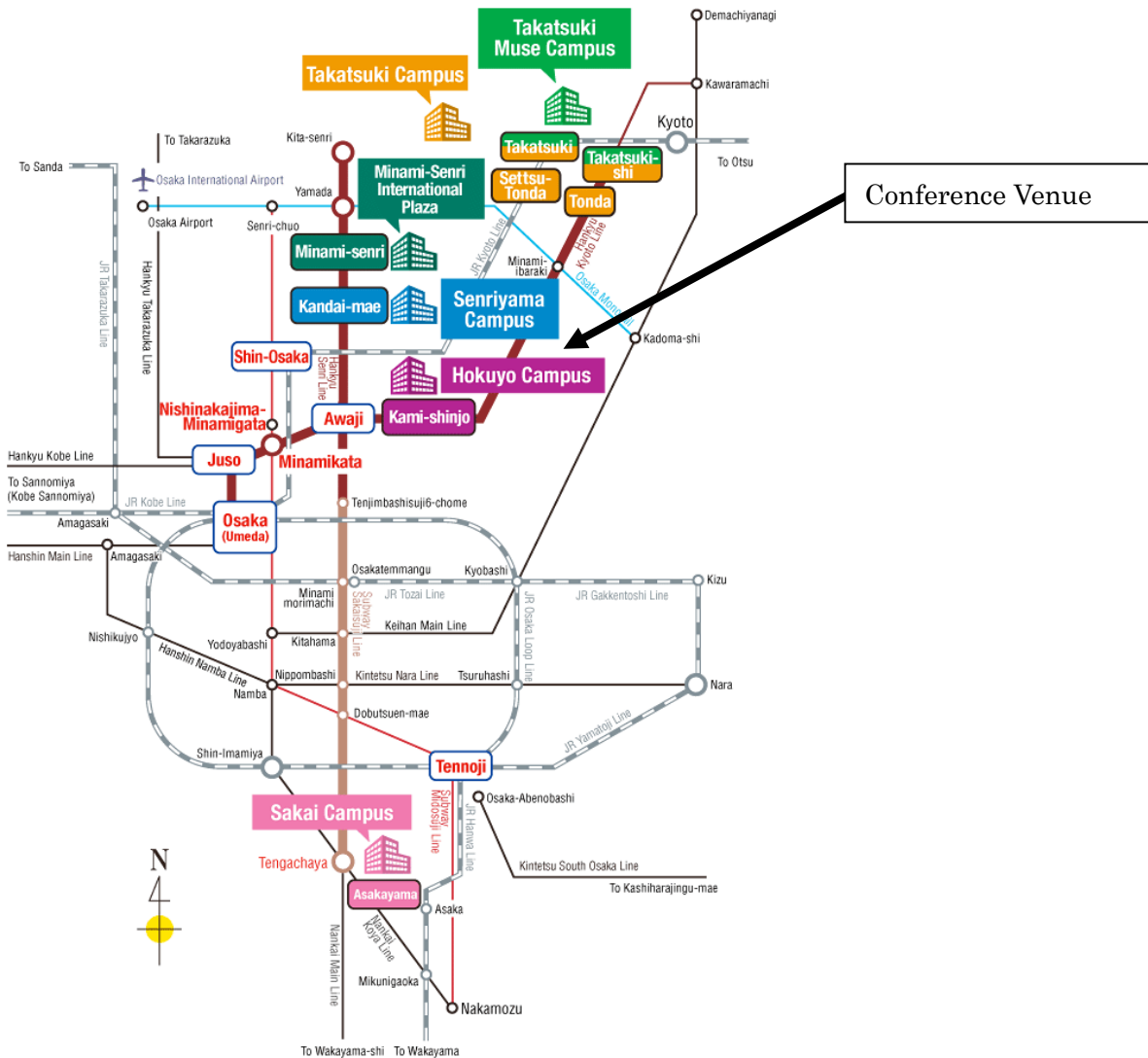

Location and Transportation for Kansai University Senriyama Campus



From Osaka (Umeda Station):

- Umeda Station (Hankyu Senri Line bound for Kita-senri) → (20 min) → Kandaimae Station → 5 minutes walk to KU
- Umeda Station (Hankyu Kyoto Line bound for Kawaramachi except via limited express) → Awaji Station (Senri Line bound for Kita-senri) → Kandaimae Station → 5 minutes walk to KU

From Shin-Osaka (Shinkansen / JR Shin-Osaka Station):

- Shin-Osaka Station (Subway Midosuji Line bound for Nakamozu) → Nishinakajima Station → Transfer to Hankyu Railway Minamikata Station (Senri Line bound for Kita-senri) → Kandaimae Station → 5 minutes walk to KU
- Shin-Osaka Station (JR Kyoto Line bound for Kyoto via local train) → Suita Station → 5 minutes walk → Transfer to Hankyu Bus JR- Suita-Kitaguchi Stop (operated every 25 minutes) → 7 minutes board → Kansai-Daigaku Stop → 7 minutes walk to KU

From Osaka International Airport (Itami Airport):

- Osaka Airport Station on Osaka Monorail bound for Kadoma-shi → Yamada Station → Transfer to Hankyu Railway bound for Umeda/Nakamozu → Kandaimae Station → 5 minutes walk to KU
