Profile: Dr Danilo Scholz specializes in the history of

modern political thought and European intellectual history. He obtained his PhD from the EHESS in 2018, by investigating how insights from ethnological, psychoanalytical and geographical research reshaped concepts and critiques of the state in twentieth-century postwar French thought. He was awarded the Heinrich Mann Prize 2019 for his essays and other articles about Europe.

Abstract: The seminar paper examines an intersection between
